

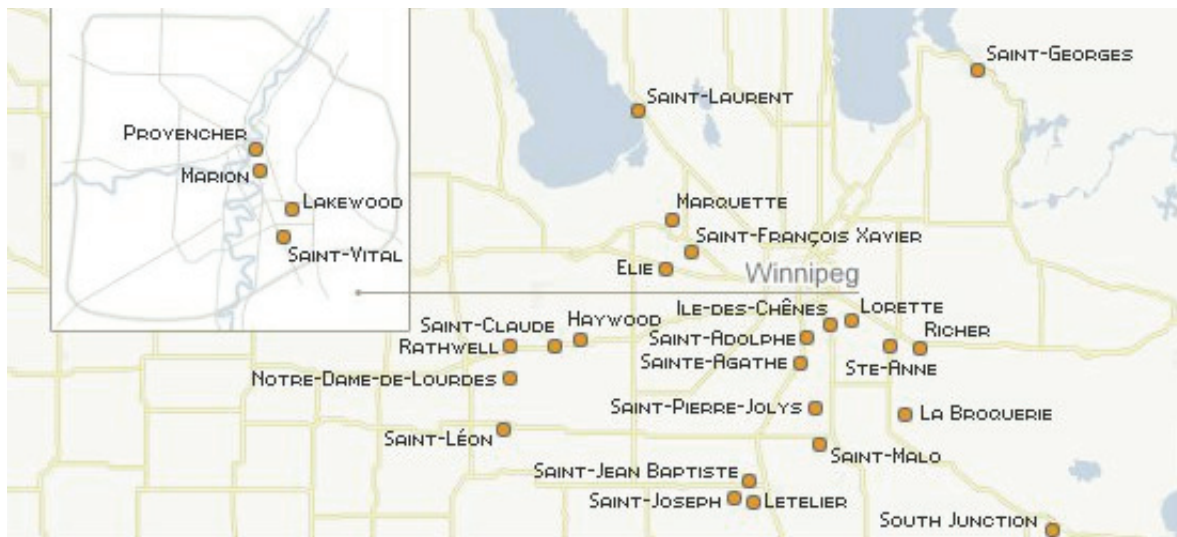
INDIVIDUAL CAISSES AND COMBINED CAISSES

Q & A

Q. Why are Caisse La Prairie, Saint-Boniface, Pembina and Elie considering a merger?

R. Our Caissees are financially sound, and bringing these four financial co-operatives together would not diminish this, but rather provide an opportunity to improve economies of scale to ensure ongoing competitiveness. In addition to providing benefits to members in improved distribution via greater branch access, this merger would enable us to expand our products and services to meet the needs of all members. At the same time, we would be able to benefit from spreading costs across a larger membership base. This merger would also enable us to be more competitive in a rapidly changing economic environment.

Q. How would this merger affect me as a member?

R. Members would continue to receive the same professional service from the same friendly employees at their local branch. One significant advantage would be the ability to access financial services from 26 branch locations in 24 Manitoba communities. With member service as the cornerstone of our operating philosophy, the new Caisse would review its product and pricing policies with the intent of providing greater value for the member.

Q. Is there a danger of the Caisse operating more like a bank?

R. Not at all. Members will continue to be member-owners of this Caisse and will continue to participate in its overall direction through the annual general meeting.
